

	DEDUCTIVE ARGUMENT	INDUCTIVE ARGUMENT
Purpose of argument:	Tries to show that the conclusion is <i>definitely</i> true	Tries to show that the conclusion is <i>probably</i> true
How we evaluate:	- <i>Valid</i> or <i>invalid</i> - <i>Sound</i> or <i>unsound</i>	- <i>Strong</i> or <i>weak</i>

	VALID	SOUND	STRONG
What it means:	<i>If the premises are all true, then the conclusion must be true</i>	The argument is <i>valid</i> , and the premises are all true	If the premises are true, then the conclusion is <i>likely</i> to be true
What kind of argument it applies to:	Deductive	Deductive	Inductive
