# THEA 80A-Theory and Technique of Acting for the Camera Winter 2024 De Anza College

**COURSE DESCRIPTION:** This course will introduce students to the basics of on camera acting. We will cover vocabulary, behind the scenes work, performance preparation, on camera performance and basic auditioning and marketing information. Through on camera interviews, auditions, improvisations and scene study the student will develop an understanding of the actor's relationship to the camera.

#### STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES:

- 1. Recognize the process by which actors are interviewed, auditioned, and cast for all forms of on media production.
- 2. Practice and distinguish effective body movement and voice modulation as it pertains to camera acting styles, camera angle and shot size and continuity of takes.
- 3. Demonstrate the basic skills in the practice and performance of scripted work for the camera and the subsequent critiquing of the work including self evaluation.

#### **COURSE OBJECTIVE:**

- 1. Demonstrate a knowledge of the camera media from an actor's perspective.
- 2. Analyze, rehearse and perform scripted material on camera.
- 3. Develop an awareness of studio layout, studio personnel and vocabulary.
- 4. Learn the skills to create, develop and perform a character.
