Student Learning Outcome: 1: Practice writing as a multi-step process including planning and revising with attention to varying purposes, audiences, and rhetorical strategies. 2. Read and analyze rhetorically and culturally diverse narrative and expository texts from a variety of perspectives.

Reading Assignments: There will be several readings a week followed by homework assignments and response writing. All specifications will be emailed weekly.

Writing Assignments: There will be four typed out-of-class essays required. Typed format will be demonstrated in a handout given before each essay following the 2016 MLA (Modern Language Association) format. See *Patterns for College Writing* pages 737-758 and Purdue Owl on the internet for additional MLA clarification.

Revisions: The last week of class (the week of Finals), you may select one essay to rewrite for a higher grade (for example, to boost a B grade up to an A grade).

Late Papers/Missed Assignments: You will not be allowed to make up any homework or essay unless you have discussed this with me by email. Also, any student who misses three homework assignments in a row without contacting me will be dropped.
